Background: Experiences offered by the lodges cover almost anything you would want to do in regional Australia. You can swim with whale sharks (Sal Salis Ningaloo Reef), snorkel and dive at some of the worlds most beautiful reefs (Great Barrier Reef, Ningaloo Reef), hike world renown trails (Mount Gower on Lord Howe Island, Wineglass Bay Freycinet, The Flinders Ranges), taste some of the world's best wines (Barossa, Margaret River); and some of Australia's outstanding regional produce (Lake House Daylesford, Cape Lodge, Appellation at The Louise Barossa Valley, Kangaroo Island); horse-ride (in the dramatic Blue Mountains landscape and Wolgan Valley), sail (the Whitsundays), fish for Barramundi (The Kimberley, Kakadu), golfing (Dent Island PGA Championship Course, Hamilton Island), discovering Australia's extraordinary wildlife (Southern Ocean Lodge), birdlife (Bamurru Plains), desert and indigenous culture (Longitude 131 - Uluru).

Lodge staff will go out of their way to: provide private introductions to winemakers in the Barossa Valley, find the best fishing spots in the Kimberley, offer expert guiding and wilderness and wildlife knowledge at Bamurru Plains, Sal Salis, Wolgan Valley and Southern Ocean Lodge; professional diving and snorkeling guidance at Lizard Island; offer private cooking classes with the chefs at Spicers Clovelly Estate or Pretty Beach House; or create culinary adventures and master classes with the exec chefs from Cape Lodge, Lake House and Saffire. And now the Daintree rainforest of Far North Queensland.
