## Indigenous Artists-in-Residence Program at Longitude 131°

Australia's most remote luxury outpost, Longitude 131°, has announced dates for its popular Indigenous artists-in-residence program for 2021. The program offers guests at Longitude 131° a chance to meet the artists from the Ernabella Arts Community in the Anangu Pitjantjatjara Yankunytjatjara (APY) Lands whose vibrant ceramics, paintings and weavings are seen around the luxury basecamp.

Part of an ongoing partnership between Longitude 131° and the arts community, the artists-in-residence program sees a small number of the artists travel to Longitude 131° from their home in the Pukatja Homelands. The artists spend a few days on each visit setting up an open studio in the Dune House and painting with a view to Uluru.

This year, the artists have planned five visits\* to the luxury lodge, the highest number to date:

April 19-22 | June 21-24 | August 16-19 | October 5-8 | November 22-25

Located some 250km - or a 30-minute scenic flight - from Longitude 131°, Ernabella was originally established as an Aboriginal mission craft room. Today, Ernabella Arts Inc is today a thriving art community that has ensured the preservation of indigenous art heritage and culture. The artists' colourful ceramics, canvases, tiles and spears (kulata) are seen in guest tents, in the Dune House bar and restaurant and Spa Kinara. Many artworks are also for sale in the boutique.

Proceeds from the artwork commissions and sales contribute directly to the community's income, ensuring the sustainable economic growth and preservation of culture for its residents. Guests can also visit Ernabella by way of a private lodge tour combined with return charter flights.

Baillie Lodges has entered into a partnership with the Ernabella Arts Inc in 2017 to support a dedicated ceramist to train and mentor the artists, so far providing \$200,000. Baillie Lodges Founder Hayley Baillie established the partnership with Ernabella as well as with other Indigenous art communities in the region. She sees the artists-in-residence program as a meaningful way to provide the community with the resources for sustainable economic self-sufficiency while at the same time ensuring the survival of the artwork, community and culture.

"We're very pleased that our relationship with Ernabella continues to evolve in so many ways, with benefits in equal measure for our guests, the artists and the community at Ernabella," Mrs Baillie said.
